

INTRODUCTION

- l. <u>PURPOSE</u>. Clothing Almanacs show monthly requirements for items of military clothing to be used in a particular region. They are intended to aid logistic planners by indicating not only the most suitable military clothing for each month, but also the climatic and geographic conditions which make such clothing suitable. The tables can be used in planning clothing issue and seasonal clothing renovation, in scheduling warehouse operations to make maximum use of critical space, in estimating the probable amounts of use and wear of various items and consequent requirements for their replacement.
- a. <u>Distribution</u>. The Almanacs are distributed for guidance to theater, Army, and other commanders responsible for authorizing the issue of discretionary items, and for information to commanders of posts, camps, stations, and divisions or equivalent organizations.
- 2. <u>DESCRIPTION</u>. Clothing Almanacs supplement T/A 21, which specifies total yearly clothing allowances for each of seven world-wide zones. Each T/A 21 Clothing Allowance Zone is based on the average temperatures of the coldest and warmest months, as shown in Table 1.

For each zone, T/A 21 lists the items that are required or mandatory. It also lists for each zone the items that are discretionary. (Discretionary items are not required by all personnel within the respective zones, but they are essential to the operating efficiency of certain personnel because of duty assignments which may involve greater exposure to environmental conditions.) Within the framework of T/A 21, Clothing Almanacs show monthly clothing requirements in specific regions, indicating essential items in these regions.

- a. Basis. Clothing Almanacs are based on a detailed study of local environmental conditions. Each Almanac specifies the clothing most likely to be needed by troops for adequate protection against these conditions during round-the-clock operations. Of primary concern in preparing an Almanac is the amount and kind of clothing needed by a soldier in the field while his activity is relatively light. During strenuous activity, troops need less clothing; when completely at rest, they require more to remain comfortable. Clothing Almanacs show the items that will give troops adequate protection for at least 90 percent of the time, and in an average year any particular item can be expected to be used at least 30 percent of the time during the months specified.
- b. Regions. Clothing Almanacs are issued for particular regions (e.g., Alaska, Japan, Northeast Africa, etc.) which include parts of two or more T/A 2l Clothing Allowance Zones. Each Clothing Almanac Region is further subdivided into a number of Clothing Requirement Areas, according to differences in monthly clothing requirements. Although all Clothing Requirement Areas within any one of the T/A 2l Clothing Allowance Zones have the same basic annual clothing allowances, they differ in monthly clothing needs.
- (1) Clothing Requirement Areas are of two types, nonmountainous and mountainous. The latter are given a special designation to indicate that field conditions and, consequently, clothing requirements may change rapidly within a relatively short horizontal distance. The mountainous Areas are divided into elevation intervals, each of which has different clothing needs. Thus, in effect, each interval represents a Clothing Requirement Area and clothing needs of troops operating within mountains can be determined for any elevation.
- (2) Each Clothing Requirement Area is assigned an identifying symbol. Nonmountainous Areas are designated by Roman numerals of the Clothing Zones in which they occur, together with an identifying Letter (e.g., VI-A). Mountainous Areas are designated by the Roman numerals of the Clothing Allowance Zones of their lowest elevations, together with an identifying number (e.g., VI-2). Although Clothing Requirement Areas in different Clothing Almanacs may have identical designations, they do not necessarily have the same environmental conditions or monthly clothing requirements. For example, monthly clothing requirements in Alaska VII-C are not the same as those in Greenland VII-C.
- c. Map. Clothing Requirement Areas of the Region are shown on two maps in the back of the Almanac. Distinctive boundaries separate Clothing Allowance Zones; single-line boundaries separate the individual Clothing Requirement Areas. Areas are numbered according to the system outlined above.

- d <u>Tables</u>. For each Clothing Requirement Area or mountain elevation interval there is a table in the Clothing Almanac. Months are shown along the top, and the clothing items are listed on the left-hand side of the page. Need for an item is shown by a solid bar drawn opposite the item and in the proper month-column. The absence of such a bar means that the item is not needed in that month. For each mountain interval, elevations in feet above sea level are given at the top of the page.
- e. New Items. All items listed in the clothing tables are authorized in T/A 21, Mobilization, 27 Jan 50, for the respective zones. As improvements are made and new items are standardized, they automatically replace the older ones in the tables as well as in requisitions. Upon standardization of completely new items, which are not simply improvements but are so different as not to be comparable to older items, special instructions for their use will be furnished in official Quartermaster publications.
- f. Items Listed. In the tables, the clothing items have been grouped and arranged alphabetically under the headings of Body Clothing, Footgear, Handgear, Headgear, and Sleeping Equipment. For many items, model numbers, shade numbers, etc., have been eliminated to conserve space.
- (1) Both discretionary and mandatory items are included in the tables. Discretionary items are indicated by an asterisk (*).
- (2) No requirements are shown for specialized equipment, such as that for low-mountain and alpine areas, (T/A 21, Part III, Section II) which may be authorized by the commanding general, theater of operations, or by the Department of the Army for individuals undergoing special training in continental United States. (Boots, ski-mountain are considered specialized.)
- (3) Certain îtems which are mandatory throughout the world, such as Drawers, cotton and Belt, waist are not included in the tables.
- (4) Also excluded are items in the nature of equipment rather than clothing: insignia, toilet articles, knives, snowshoes, tents, steel helmets, etc.
- (5) Under the heading "Anti-Insect" need is indicated for: Gloves, mosquito; Headnet, mosquito; Bar, insect, field; and Repellent, insect.





Fig. 1. Footgear wears out quickly on the loose sharp stones and gravels characteristic of wide areas in Portugal, Spain, and southern France (shown here in the "maquis" area of southern France, Area III-A).

CLOTHING ALMANAC FOR WESTERN EUROPE

1. GENERAL.

- a. Political Units and Clothing Requirement Areas. The clothing almanac region for Western Europe includes Portugal and the Azores Islands, Spain and the Balearic Islands, Andorra, Monaco, France, Luxembourg, Belgium, the Netherlands, and the Channel Islands. Four of the seven Clothing Allowance Zones of T/A 21 are represented within the Region: Zones II, III, IV, and VI, a subtropical to cold temperate range of clothing needs. Clothing requirements vary, however, with climatic and geographical diversity within the Zones, so that they have been divided into 8 mountainous and 9 nonmountainous Clothing Requirement Areas. Within each of the Areas month by month clothing needs are quite uniform.
- b. <u>Physical Regions</u>. Terrain is diverse, varying from low coastal plains and river valleys to hills, plateaus, and high rugged mountains. Generally speaking, the three classes of topography that characterize this region are: (1) lowlands, (2) uplands, and (3) high mountains.
- (1) Lowlands. The flat to gently rolling terrain of the western European lowlands includes notably the flat man-made polders of the Netherlands; the lowlands of northwest Belgium and the Paris "basin" (Fig. 2); southern and western France; the river valleys of western Portugal and southwestern and eastern Spain; and coastal plains of various sizes. Where mountains or plateaus approach the coast, as in northwestern Spain and southeastern France, lowlands are small and interrupted by steep headlands.

Collectively, the lowlands are more uniform in climate than the upland areas. Transportation, by water or land is not difficult. These lowlands, together with the lowlands of the other western European countries, contain the bulk of Europe's population.

(2) <u>Uplands</u>. Uplands, consisting of plateaus and low mountains, include the greater part of interior Iberia (the "Meseta" of Spain and its bordering uplands), the "Massif" of south central France, the Vosges and Ardennes mountains of northeastern France and southeastern Belgium. These regions are characterized by many wide interstream divides, forming level to rolling land at higher elevations.

Climate is more severe than in the surrounding lowlands, with generally lower winter temperatures, and with the exception of most of Spain, greater annual precipitation. However, there is a gradual climatic change from south to north, from the plateaus of Spain to the Ardennes; winter temperatures become lower, summers milder, and precipitation heavier. This is reflected in the natural vegetation: the foothills and plateaus of Spain and southern France (Fig. 1) are characterized by a typical Mediterranean growth of scrub trees and grasses; the "Massif" is typified by grassy valleys and forested interstream ridges; the Vosges and the Ardennes are heavily forested. With the exception of some widely separated urban settlements, nowhere are these uplands densely populated.

The uplands also include the low mountains of the two western peninsulas of France (Cherbourg, Brest), which are rainy and foggy most of the year. Forests are confined to sheltered areas, and the wind-swept open land is covered with moors. Population is unevenly distributed; the chief economy is grazing.

(3) <u>High Mountains</u>. The most conspicuous mountains of the region are the Pyrenees between France and Spain, the Alps on the eastern border of France, and the Sierra Nevada in southern Spain. They are characterized by steep slopes, rugged terrain, and rapid changes upward to colder climates. Transportation across the Alps and Pyrenees is difficult; there are few good passes, and these assume great economic and strategic importance. The most important land routes between France and Spain run near the coasts around the ends of the Pyrenees. Population is sparse, and is concentrated largely in the valleys.

The Sierra de Guadarrama of central Spain and the Cordillera Cantabrica of northern Spain are rugged mountains but are lower and less formidable barriers than the Alps and Pyrenees.

2. ENVIRONMENT AND CLOTHING.

a. Climate

(1) <u>Comparisons</u>. Climatically, Western Europe is similar to the Pacific coastal portion of the United States (Table 2). Southern Spain and Portugal are much like southern California: winters are mild and moderately moist, summers are warm and dry. The interior of Spain has little rainfall in any season. The north coast of Spain and the Bay of Biscay coast of France are similar to northern California and Oregon: winters are cool and wet, summers are mild and are considered dry even though northern Spain and southwest France may receive appreciable amounts of rain.

Northwest France, western Belgium, and the Netherlands are somewhat like the Puget Sound area of Washington: winters are cool, summers mild. Rainfall, however, differs in seasonal distribution: whereas precipitation is rather evenly distributed seasonally in northern France, Belgium, and the Netherlands, winter rainfall far exceeds that of summer in northern Washington.

(2) <u>Winter</u>. For the greater part of this region, the winters are best described as <u>wet-cold</u>. Areas above 7,000 or 8,000 feet in the Alps and Pyrenees have Arctic conditions in winter. The Azores and Balearic Islands, and the southern coasts of Spain and Portugal, are cool (mean temperatures generally above 50°F) rather than cold.

Wet-cold means a combination of wet ground and temperatures around freezing (averages 23° to 50°F), with frequent, although not necessarily heavy, precipitation. Hands, face, and clothing are kept wet for long periods of time, with consequent chilling of the entire body. Under these conditions the extremities, particularly the feet, cool most rapidly when men are inactive. Even though adequate footgear is worn, trenchfoot may result if feet are not cared for properly. Suitable clothing will (1) provide adequate insulation for existing temperatures, and (2) keep hands, feet, and inner clothing dry. Proper clothing combinations for wet-cold conditions are listed and discussed in Section 3.

Winter precipitation is generally frequent and of long duration in most sections of the region, and keeping clothing dry may be difficult. Precipitation is heaviest along the Atlantic coast and in the mountains. Although the annual total of 30 to 40 inches along the entire Atlantic coast (III-3, III-B, III-D, and IV-A) is well distributed seasonally, precipitation falls on a greater number of days in winter than summer. Mediterranean coasts and interior Spain are the driest sections of the region, with 10 to 20 inches per year, most of it during the cooler part of the year.

Winter winds in high mountain areas are normally strong, reducing the insulating effect of clothing. At 32°F, one more layer of clothing is needed when the wind is 10 mph than when it is calm. In the Pyrenees, for example, at elevations above 8,000 feet, the Parka is recommended, not because of the cold (average monthly temperatures are above 14°F), but because wind speeds normally are rather high. Winter winds are strong also along all Atlantic facing coasts. The Rhone Valley and the adjoining Mediterranean coastal areas occasionally experience a very strong cold winter wind, the mistral, from the north.

(3) <u>Summer</u>. The summer season is hot and dry throughout most of Iberia and southern France (Zones II and III), and mild and pleasant in the Low Countries and northern and western France (Zones IV and VI). Woolen clothing is recommended for summertime wear in Zones IV and VI, whereas cotton clothing is preferable for the warmer Zones II and III. Below 2,000 feet in the Pyrenees, and along the north coast of Spain (Area III-3), where average temperatures change rapidly within short distances, both woolen and cotton clothing are recommended (Table 3) as protection and to provide comfort. In Zone II (the Azores Islands and southern Spain and Portugal), Jacket & Trousers, lightweight, special are suitable for combat troops.

In southern and interior Spain and Mediterranean France, the range of actual temperatures experienced during July and August may be greater than 40°F. For example, at Seville (II-B), afternoon temperatures of 105°F or greater are common, and early morning temperatures sometimes are below 65°F. Such a variation in temperature requires flexibility in use of the uniform; items not needed during the day may be necessary for protection at night.

In the Mediterranean areas, summer skies are usually clear, humidities are low, and daytime temperatures high. Under these conditions, the skin may dry out and burn easily; precaution should be taken against sumburn. Dry summer winds blowing sand and dust in interior and southern Spain may render eye shields or headcloths advisable for face and eye protection.

Europe, spring and fall. For any particular Area within Western Europe, spring and fall clothing needs are intermediate between those of summer and winter. Clothing for these transitional months is comprised of elements from both the summer and winter uniforms. The tables show an apparent excess of items in these months, and enough variety of clothing is recommended to provide adequate and comfortable protection against the changing weather.

b. Surface Conditions

(1) Snow Cover. The average number of days per year with snow cover (Table 3) is an indication of the need for Parka & Trousers, field, overwhite, Mittens, overwhite, and sun glasses or goggles. Overwhites are indicated in the tables for those months when a snow cover is likely to exist, but their use is dependent upon the existing snow cover. Within any Clothing Requirement Area of Western Europe, any particular year may be snow-free or nearly snow-free except for the mountain peaks.

In general, there is little or no requirement for the snow camouflage clothing in Spain, Portugal, the Azores, and southern France, except at the upper levels of mountainous terrain. In the Low Countries and in central and northern France, overwhites may be needed from 2 to 5 winter months. In the mountains of western France, the period lengthens with increasing elevation until at the uppermost elevations the snow camouflage uniform may be required in all seasons except summer.

- (2) <u>Wet ground</u>. Swamp and marsh conditions exist all year in many of the river valleys and river deltas. For these areas <u>Shoepacs</u> are desirable. Almost everywhere, the ground is moist enough in winter to make <u>Shoepacs</u> preferable to any other footgear. Exceptions are the high Alps and Pyrenees, where the ground is frozen and snow-covered, and the Mediterranean coast of Spain and the Azores, where temperatures are high enough (above 50°F) to minimize danger from wet-cold surface conditions.
- c. <u>Insects</u>. Anti-insect equipment is recommended for all of Western Europe except the upper levels of mountain areas. Insect pests include the mosquito, sandfly, and housefly. Their period of activity is confined to four or five summer months in the northeast of the region (VI-A), lengthens southward to 6 or 8 months in Mediterranean France and interior Spain (III-A and III-C), and persists all or most of the year in the Azores Islands, the southern coasts of Portugal and Spain, and the Balearic Islands (II-A and II-B).
- (1) Mosquitoes. Mosquitoes in particular may become a problem not only because of their irritating habits, but because certain species carry malaria. In all densely populated districts, anti-mosquito measures have greatly reduced their numbers, and drainage of much low-lying marsh, especially in France and the Netherlands, serves as an effective control. In the dry lands of interior and southern Spain, breeding places are rare, though marshes, mountain streams, irrigated lands, and ponded waters provide local conditions conducive to infestation. Above 3,000 feet in mountain areas, the mosquito nuisance is less acute. The distribution of mosquitoes, then, either because of controls or natural restrictions, is irregular, and anti-insect equipment should be available for use where needed.

Malaria has been reported in all parts of the region but is of special significance only in two widely separated districts: the Netherlands and Iberia.

In the Netherlands, "house-malaria" is a special winter problem. With the approach of cold weather, the malaria mosquito enters houses or other heated buildings where it feeds on humans. By February or March, malaria incidence is at its peak. Though winter is generally considered the inactive season for insects, special anti-insect protection may be necessary in the Netherlands because of the malaria hazard.

In Iberia, malaria is considered the greatest problem among diseases of military importance. It often is epidemic along the coasts of Portugal and southern Spain, and along the major river valleys such as those of the Douro in northeast Portugal and the Ebro in northeastern Spain. Malaria outbreaks are most common in summer, especially late summer.

(2) Sandflies. Sandflies have been reported throughout the region and are especially numerous along the Mediterranean coasts of Spain and France, where they are associated with outbreaks of sandfly fever. Sandflies are night biters and are especially active on warm humid summer nights. Their small size enables them to penetrate ordinary screen wire and bed net material.

3. CLOTHING SUMMARY.

Clothing needs for Western Europe are shown in detail, item by item and month by month, in the Clothing Requirements tables at the end of this Almanac. For convenience, they may be summarized into three groups, each suitable for wear in areas where the average monthly temperatures are generally between certain values:

WARM Weather Clothing, above 68°F COOL Weather Clothing, between 50° and 68°F COLD Weather Clothing, between 14° and 50°F

For each Clothing Requirement Area, as shown on the two maps in the back of the Almanac, the months during which each of these groups of clothing items are suitable for wear are indicated in Table 4. The clothing items making up each group (Tables 5, 6, and 7) are primarily those suitable for simultaneous wear (except as indicated) by troops of Class A, B, and C units (T/A 21 Mbl, part I, par. 2b). These units habitually operate in the forward active combat zone, or in the service area of the combat zone, where housing usually is not provided, and their troops must have clothing suitable for 24-hour living outdoors. In addition, Tables 5, 6, and 7 indicate possible deletions or substitutions of items for use by troops of Class D and E units, whose normal working and living conditions, at airfields and other permanent or semi-permanent installations where housing is provided, are not as rigorous.

Certain items, such as belts and suspenders, which are not listed in the Clothing Requirements tables, are shown in the summary tables. In addition, the summaries indicate the recommended minimum numbers of each item for each class of troops; consequently, glove-liners and socks are



listed separately from the gloves or footgear with which they are worn (and with which they are listed in the Clothing Requirements tables), so that the number of spares can be shown.

The generalizations of Tables 4, 5, 6, and 7 are convenient for preliminary planning, but for detailed estimates of clothing requirements, the more precise listings of the Clothing Requirements tables should be used. In establishing the requirements as shown in these tables, the normal variations in conditions from year to year have been considered. Nevertheless, the lengths of the seasons may vary so much in certain unusual years that some items may be required for longer or shorter periods than indicated. Since an attempt is made to show clothing needs for troops engaged in most types of activities, the Clothing Requirements tables sometimes indicate need at the same time for items that are not meant to be worn simultaneously. Duplicate items may also be indicated where conditions vary so much locally that no single item will be entirely satisfactory throughout the Area.

Certain Cold Weather clothing items provide the "wet-cold" protection referred to previously. Shoepacs are expressly for use on wet or water-logged ground and are not meant to replace the combat boot entirely (Fig. 3). The field jacket and cotton field trousers, when worn as outer-most garments, usually give adequate protection from moisture, wind, and cold. The poncho or raincoat is usually required during periods of precipitation. Of the jackets listed under Cold Weather clothing, the pile jacket is strictly for out-of-doors wear, under the field jacket, while the wool jacket may be worn alone out-of-doors, on warm days, and for regular garrison wear.

In all mountainous areas, specialized mountaineering equipment and clothing are normally necessary, in addition to the clothing listed. At 6,000 feet and above in the Alps (Area VI-I) and at 8,000 feet and above in the Pyrenees (Area III-3), there is a winter need for <u>Parka-liner</u>, pile, <u>& Parka-shell</u>, cotton, od, and <u>Mittens</u>, <u>Arctic</u>, in addition to other Cold Weather clothing.

Because of the different authorizations for Zones II and III in T/A 21, Jacket & Trousers, herringbone twill are used in Zone III and Jacket & Trousers, lightweight in Zone II. Likewise, Cap, herringbone twill is used in Zones II and III and Cap, field, cotton, od, w/visor in Zones IV and VI.

4. SUPPLEMENTARY ARMY PUBLICATIONS.

Information concerning the construction, function, manner of wear, and approved methods of care of each item of clothing may be found in one or more of the following Army publications.

- a. FM 70-10: Mountain Operations (December 1944). Chapter 1, General Considerations; Chapter 4, Conditioning and Acclimatization; Chapter 6, Weather; and Chapter 7, Winter Characteristics, discuss the relationship between the soldier and the mountain environment.
- b. FM 31-25: <u>Desert Operations</u> (March 1942). Section I gives general aspects and problems of desert environment. Section II gives general consideration of the food, clothing, and individual equipment needs.
- c. FM 21-15: <u>Individual Clothing and Equipment</u> (April 1945). Emphasis is placed on the care of clothing and equipment and methods of assembling and packing.

- d. TM 10-228: Fitting of Shoes and Socks (February 1946). The importance of proper shoe fitting methods, foot measuring equipment and procedure, sock fitting and size correlation, and size data for boots and shoes including approved sock combinations, are the more important sections of this manual.
- e. TM 10-275: Principles of Cold Weather Clothing and Equipment (October 1944). The proper use, care, and maintenance of cold weather clothing and equipment are discussed for the principal items protecting the body, the feet, the hands, and the head. The principles of insulation on the layer basis, proper fitting and sizing of clothing, the importance of clean, dry clothing, and the relationships between body activity and clothing amounts are emphasized. Specifications are furnished as to the actual temperatures when certain outer protective items of clothing and equipment are to be worn.
- f. FM 70-15: Operations in Snow and Extreme Cold (November 1944). Chapter 3, Clothing, is a generalization of TM 10-275; Chapter 5, Snow Shoes; Chapter 6, Skiing; and Chapter 9, Equipment, are of special interest.

6. CLOTHING REQUIREMENT TABLES.

The 30 tables of Clothing Requirements for the 17 Areas of Western Europe are arranged according to Clothing Allowance Zones, those for Zone II being followed by those of Zones III and IV, and finally, Zone VI. Within each Zone, the tables for nonmountainous areas come first, in alphabetical order; the mountain area tables follow in numerical order, with the tables for the lowest elevations of each area coming first, then for upper levels in ascending order.

Areas to which each table applies are shown on the folding maps in the back. For best use of the tables, especially as regards selection from them of clothing items best suited to the individual location and year, the preceding text should be consulted.


